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
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- Generally, a regular process

▶ 'meet' $[mext] \rightarrow [mixt]$

- ightharpoonup 'name' [nam:ə] → [ne:m]

- ightharpoonup 'meet' [me:t] → [mi:t]

- ▶ 'meat' [mɛɪt] \rightarrow [miɪt]

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- ightharpoonup 'house' [hu:sə] → [haus]
